THE TRANSFIGURATION

It's that time again to start thinking all about the Transfiguration – you know - that bit where Moses and Elijah and Jesus are together on top of a mountain and Peter (who's there with James and John) has absolutely no idea of what's going on. And most of us have no clue either.

In Matthew 5:17 Jesus says "I have not come to abolish the law or the prophets but to fulfil them" and here on the mountain He underlines that saying - here is Moses – he is the start of the Old Testament and represents the Law– here is Elijah – he is the last of the prophets and represents the Prophets and is effectively the finish of Old Testament and here is Jesus – the New testament – the fulfilment of all that has gone before – the beginning of the New Testament – and this is the pivotal point where human nature meets God.

The road that Jesus is embarking upon is in accord with the law and the prophets but His teaching is so different that it needs God's sanction to approve it.

The voice of God from heaven identifies Jesus as His Son (as that voice has done so many times before) but here it underscores the move from the Old to the New and reinforces the teachings of Jesus.

But His teachings are not yet ready for all to hear so He warns the three disciples that they have to wait until He is risen from the dead – and whilst they agree "they discussed among themselves what risen from the dead could mean"

We now know about the resurrection, and if we are unlikely to have a transfiguration in our lives we can be certain that we are listening to the word of God
