**Dear Parishioners** 

Water. Precious, essential, potentially powerful and destructive, cleansing, nourishing.

This Lent we are using the Gospels of Year A (because these are meant to particularly assist adults preparing for baptism at Easter), alongside the Year C first readings. This week the Gospel is about the encounter and dialogue of Jesus with the Samaritan woman at the well (John 4).

The dialogue operates at many levels - around physical thirst (Jesus), physical effort (the woman having to come out of the village to fetch water), cross-cultural and cross-religious encounter (Jews-Samaritans), the search for a sustaining spiritual depth (living water) and the dialogue of life (who/what might these '5 husbands' be?).

Jesus and the Samaritan woman meet each other at a deep level. For each of us we are invited to a similar dialogue with God, starting where we are (thirsty, tired?) and in the dialogue with Jesus uncovering our deepest hopes and deepest entrapments.

Jesus represents the God who comes to sit with us during our everyday tasks, essential or not. He comes to talk with us about the things that matter in our lives, mundane or more. Are we ready to enter into that dialogue? And are we ready, like the Samaritan woman, to be changed in the process and tell others about what we have experienced, bringing others to that encounter?
