#### "It's only right that we rejoice...!"

We might all think "what sort of reasoning is that"? Just because someone says it's right doesn't mean that it is.

The younger son was so fixed and hungry on using a monetary 'inheritance' that he did away with every bit of it.

Once he did away with every bit of money he had, he was still unaware that his human dignity didn't depend on what he had or not. Until his Father treated him otherwise.

We find out that the eldest son also didn't understand about the concept of inheritance either. His form of justice was one very different to the Father's. He thought he should be rewarded more than others simply because of how better he had been. Maybe, around serving the church or the community or the charity he thought he had given. He became possessive of his own exclusive 'patch' of the Kingdom. But, he didn't see the transformation that had occurred in his younger brother's heart.

The real inheritance isn't the money, or the acclaim we can get from our good works. It's accepting the love and embrace of God.

Mission isn't about dividing monetary inheritances or throwing money at things or people. How well resources are spent is based on how well the blessings and generosity of God are revealed in our lives, who affirms our infinite dignity.

We can rejoice whether we have little or many monetary treasures in our own patch, or whether we hold important offices or not. God loves our honesty.
