Twenty Eighth week of Ordinary Time 13 October 2024, Year B Readings: Wisdom 7:7-11 Hebrews 4:12-13 Mark 10:17-30

In the Book of Genesis, we read that we are made in the image of God—male and female. He created us. He breathed His breath into us to give us life—life from His life.

In Psalm 139 we read that God created our inmost being and knit us together in our mothers' wombs. The Psalmist then exults "I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made."

Every human person comes from God. Every person is unique and special, deeply loved by God. As life comes from God no one has the right to take the life of another person whether born or unborn. The right to life of every person is the divine law that underlies all other law.

It follows then that regardless of age, gender, ability and ethnicity we are all created equal. Every person, from conception onwards, is entitled to live a life of dignity within a family and community environment where they belong and are safe and loved. In this context abuse of any person is sinful.

To prevent abuse we are all called to look out for each other; for example, those who are struggling within themselves or with a pregnancy, or child care, or the care of an older person, or a person with a disability. It is through our prayer and practical help we contribute to building a network of love around such people that in turn will give them the energy and means to love others without resorting to abuse.

Pope John Paul II in his encyclical "The Gospel of Life" calls watching out and caring for others as building a Culture of Life as opposed to the Culture of Death that permeates our modern world. He ends by writing "a great prayer for life is urgently needed, a prayer which will rise up throughout the world."

Let our impassioned prayer for life daily rise up to God the creator and lover of all life, including our own.


