Twentieth week of Ordinary Time 18 August 2024, Year B Readings: Proverbs 9:1-6 Ephesians 5:15-20 John 6:51-58

This weekend Archbishop Paul Martin comes to the parish to celebrate Confirmation for those on their wayto first communion. Congratulations to all the families involved in this sacrament.

Baptism, confirmation and eucharist are called the 'sacraments of initiation' (into Christian living). They start us off, are meant to get us moving in our following of Jesus Christ and being part of his continuing work in our world.

In the early centuries of the Church when an adult was baptized, it usually happened at about 3am on Easter Sunday morning (the Easter Vigil and the 'hour' of Jesus' resurrection) We are baptized (immersed) in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. They were literally immersed in a baptismal pool (naked and assisted in each case by male or female deacons) in a special baptismal room attached to the church building.

Coming out of the pool they were clothed in a white garment symbolizing their second birth, symbolizing new life, being washed clean of sin. They then entered the body of the church where the congregation was gathered with their PP (episkopos/overseer/bishop) who anointed them with oil. This confirmed their baptism (Confirmation) to seal it and they were presented with their baptismal candle. Later in the same Mass they received their first communion (eucharist).

So baptism, confirmation and eucharist were all celebrated in the same ceremony. The Mass was finishing as dawn broke (darkness to light). Of course that was just the beginning.....

Refugee, Migrant and Family Support Community Outreach Worker SFOAO

It has both a delivery service and a developmental focus. The Outreach Worker reports directly to, and will be supported by, the SFOA Community Outreach Committee that is part of the SFOA Parish.

The role is offered as a fixed term one-year contract (reflecting the funding arrangements for the position) for a minimum of 16 hours, but with the option of extending up to 30 hours per week. The successful applicant will ideally have training and a background in one of the helping or community/pastoral development professions and proven experience in successfully working with different cultures and communities.


