The Body and Blood of Christ 2 June 2024, Year B Readings: Exodus 24:3-8, Hebrews 9:11-15, Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

Corpus Christi – the most Holy Body and Blood of Christ 2 June 2024

I looked down to see steel capped safety boots poking out from the priest's alb. As he transferred the Blessed Sacrament from the tabernacle to the monstrance, and placed the monstrance on the altar to enable perpetual adoration to continue. He pointed with both hands to the Blessed Sacrament and said "the Body of Christ".

Then turning to the congregation and, pointing to us with both hands, he repeated, with some emphasis, the phrase

"THE BODY OF CHRIST".

Perpetual adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is a charism of some religious congregations. While retaining their devotion to the Body of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, they, like Moses in today's first reading, and like St Paul in the second reading radically shifted their charism to focus on PEOPLE as the Body of Christ. The bread and wine do not become Jesus' Body and Blood only for the purposes of adoration.

These are valid practises, but the primary purpose that bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ is so that we may be fed. We are fed so that we can build the Body of Christ, God's people! The double pointing of the priest at that Mass: this, in the monstrance is the Body of Christ, and, we, the people, are the Body of Christ.

And the steel capped boots? The priests of the Blessed Sacrament Order frequently went to the Body of Christ in the places where that Body most needed them – including industrial work sites.

We cannot adore the Body of Christ in the tabernacle or monstrance without doing service to the Body of Christ – part of which is sitting right next to you!


On the second day, **Saturday**, **8 June** there will be a morning Mass at 8.30am followed by a day of Adoration.

Synod update

A new consultation document prepared by the bishops as part of the Holy Father's Synod 2021-24 process has been sent to Rome.

This document, titled *Towards October 2024*, follows the NZ Catholic Bishops Conference being asked to establish a consultation process to discern responses to specific questions related to the Vatican's *Synodal Church in Mission* report. That report was published after the First Session of the 16th Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops, held in Rome last October.

National Catholic lay organisations, agencies of the bishops conference, religious, diocesan bodies, educational institutions, young people's groups, parish groups and groups involved in previous synodal processes took part in the consultation, between February and April this year.

In 2018 the Cathedral of the Sacred Heart closed for earthquake strengthening and restoration. Next month it will finally be reopening, although all the work will not yet be completed.

The Cathedral, the 'Mother church of our Archdiocese', is a beautifully restored, peaceful, and prayerful space for visitors, people working in central Wellington and parishioners to worship, and drop by for a time of prayer, adoration, and reflection.

It is desired that the Cathedral is open between 10.00am and 3.00pm weekdays. However, this is only possible with the assistance of volunteers, Cathedral Guardians. We are seeking people who to fill regular weekly, or bi-weekly time slots of either 10.00am-1.00pm or 1.00-3.00pm.
