The Twelfth Week of Ordinary Time 23 June 2024, Year B Readings: Job 38: 1, 8-11, 2 Corinthians 5: 14-17, Mark 4: 35-41

Today's readings offer a look at the world that God created.

In Job, God is at pains to remind Job of what had been created for Job – and for all of us. It's a less than gentle reminder to all of us that this is what God created with the waters.

"Who pent up the sea behind closed doors when it leapt tumultuous out of the womb, when I wrapped it in a robe of mist and made black clouds its swaddling bands, when I marked the bounds it was not to cross,"

The words are majestic and poetical and they are God's rather tart response to Job when he (Job) was feeling sorry for himself and questioning God. God's response is swift, majestic and a reminder to Job that it was God who created the world and NOT humans. Today we are so tied up with our concerns about climate and pollution that we very much overlook that it is God's world in which we live and we are to remember that it is not ours to own -only ours to manage.

Then today's Psalm carries on the theme of God's control over the waters.

But the big link is from the first reading to the Gospel; in that first reading from Job God states very clearly that He has mastery over the waters – and here this mystery is displayed for the apostles to see in all its terrifying glory: one of those so sudden storms on the Sea of Galilee has sprung up and the disciples fear that their boat is to sink but when they wake an obviously exhausted Jesus He rebukes the wind and the seas and then He rebukes them for their lack of faith: but how could they know that the God who made the seas was riding with them? and He showed just how He WAS the God who controls the waters and wind.

We do not control the earth – we only manage it for God and frankly we aren't doing much of a job of that at the moment. How is it that we can produce such a miracle of engineering as the James Webb telescope which can see back to within three hundred million years of the creation and yet not be able to control the mess we have on earth?

Let us always keep God's creation in mind.
