Christ the King 24 November 2024, Year B Readings: Daniel 7: 13-14 Revelations 1: 5-8 John 18: 33-37

The popular imagery of 'Christ the King' shapes our thinking about Jesus, perhaps even distorting it a little: we risk thinking of him as some sort of finely robed and crowned medieval king 'above us', 'remote', like some sort of 'Lord of the manor', passing severe judgement like a Roman or medieval magistrate!

The Jesus I know is very different from this: from a very mixed whakapapa; resident in a tiny village; an artisan; living in a hot, arid climate; lots of walking; sleeping rough; a working class bloke; a man able to mix it with people of all social classes – including sinners of all stripes! Counter cultural - unafraid to form close and personal relationships with men and women. With people like me!

However, when we look at the history and the purpose of the solemnity of 'Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe', the title starts to make sense and our thinking corrected.

In his 1922 encyclical, written in the aftermath of WW1 Pius XI said, "...as long as individuals and states refused to submit to the rule of our Savior, there would be no really hopeful prospect of a lasting peace among nations" The subtitle of the encyclical is "On the Peace of Christ in the Kingdom of Christ";. Shortly after, in 1925, Pius XI established the solemnity we celebrate today.

Pope Pius XI wanted us to gain strength and courage to rise above nationalism and secularism, to form our lives after 'the true Christian ideal', and, 'if to Christ is given all power in heaven and on earth' then Christ must reign in our minds, in our wills, in our hearts and in our bodies. We then become, in the words of the Apostle Paul, instruments of justice unto God. (Extracted from the encyclical Quas primas, #33).

So we indeed celebrate a king, but a king totally unlike all others!



Remembrance and recommitment ceremony (Rā Maumaharatanga) at Korokoro cemetery:

You are welcome to join a peaceful hikoi starting beside the grave of famous chief Wi Tako at the Catholic Cemetery on the corner of Pito-one Street and Korokoro Road on **Sunday 1 December 2024**.

Assemble at cemetery from 1:30pm.

Our kaupapa will be to recall and pray for the tipuna interred in this important site and learn about our shared histories. It is also a reminder of the joint kaitiakitanga of this special place, cared for by Wi Tako's descendants, the Love whanau, parishioners from Te Wairua Tapu / Holy Spirit parish, and the Hutt City Council. Wi Tako was buried at Korokoro in 1887 from St Peter and Paul's church in Lower Hutt.

Following the service we will proceed – by foot or vehicle – for 15 minutes to Te Puni urupā in Te Puni Street, then another 15 minutes to Sacred Heart Church, 41 Britannia Street to share stories and a cuppa. Car parking adjacent to Korokoro cemetery.

NB: please do not bring food on to the cemeteries, food will be provided at the church.


