28 July 2024 - A genuine prophet

This Sunday we celebrate our grandparents, elders and kaumātua. We also baptise seven of our young people – people at different stages of life, all attracted to Jesus, just as the people in today's gospel are attracted to Jesus.

In today's gospel, Jesus recognises that the crowd is hungry, and does something about it. This, and His whole life are seen as a sign that He is an authentic, genuine prophet.

Psychologist Tiara Tolks describes authentic people as having "a clear sense of their life's direction, values, purpose and beliefs". Authentic people "accept their strengths and vulnerabilities and can make sense of their thoughts and emotions". "Authentic people prioritise their inner truth over conformity or favourable treatment from others".

Having fed the crowd, Jesus discerns their intention to make Him king – He escapes to the hills. Yet He moves steadily toward Jerusalem where He knows that He will have to pay the heavy cost of His authenticity.

We are all called to be authentic disciples, just as Jesus is authentic.

It is when we are authentic that we are able to fulfil the Great Commission:

"go, make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit".

And it is those who go before us, our grandparents, elders and kaumātua who lead the way.
