Food for Life

Today's readings are about being hungry and being fed.

To be hungry is to be alive and to know the satisfaction we experience when our bellies are full.

In the first reading the People complained to Moses because they were hunary. God heard them in their distress and provided bread from heaven, as much each morning as they could eat.

Hunger is both physical and spiritual. We hunger for nourishment through food and drink; we hunger for success, money and other material possessions; we hunger for love, peace and safety and warm relationships with others.

The sad reality is that millions of people throughout our world are hunary; people – young and old –die from starvation each day. The hopeful reality is that worldwide we produce enough food to feed the world's almost eight billion people. What can we each do about this?

Paul in his Letter to the Ephesians urges the people to become a new people by giving up their old way of life hungering for things of this world only and to follow the way of goodness and holiness (wholeness and health) by putting on their new self that is created in God's way.

The joyful reality of the Good News in John's Gospel is that Jesus himself is our food and drink. He tells his followers and that includes us

"I am the bread of life. They who come to me will never be hungry; they who believe in me will never thirst."

When we gather around the table of the Eucharist may we each pray a heartfelt "Thank you."

Refugee, Migrant and Family Support Community Outreach Worker This role is an integral part of the mission of our Church and a particular expression of the collaborative model of being church in the Ohariu community of communities. It has both a delivery service and a developmental focus. The Outreach Worker reports directly to, and will be supported by, the SFOA Community Outreach Committee that is part of the SFOA Parish.

The role is offered as a fixed term one-year contract (reflecting the funding arrangements for the position) for a minimum of 16 hours, but with the option of extending up to 30 hours per week. The successful applicant will ideally have training and a background in one of the helping or community/pastoral development professions and proven experience in successfully working with different cultures and communities.
