Reflection

Be Compassionate

Today's Gospel reading, set in the context of Jesus' first sermon The Beatitudes, speaks of the new life to which Jesus is calling his recently chosen apostles and his disciples.

Jesus speaks of a kind of love that is so inclusive and generous as to be overwhelming.

Blessed are we who have the model of Christ's life for living our lives.

In early times this kind of living was known as "The Way". It was at Antioch that the early church became known as Christians – followers of Christ.

Jesus exhorts us to "Be compassionate as your Father is compassionate" Luke 6: 36.

What follows, beautifully and succinctly portrays what being compassionate looks like: we suspend judgment; we refrain from condemning others; we forgive others (and ourselves); we give and we will receive in full measure.

When we live with compassionate love we experience the largesse of a generously loving God.

In the first reading from Samuel 26:2-23, David demonstrates compassionate love. Abishai his companion was all for taking the opportunity to spear Saul, their enemy, while he was lying on the ground sleeping and vulnerable. David advised Abishai against this action, choosing not to take advantage of the situation of power in which he (David) found himself.

Today let us reflect on David's song in praise of our God of Compassion and Love.

Psalm 102:

The Lord is kind and merciful; he heals every one of your ills; (he) crowns you with love and compassion; (he does not) repay us according to our faults.
