A Shifting Target.

I'm not sure about you, but I have a natural fear of failure. And like Simon Peter and the disciples, they would rather prefer doing ministry in neat and tidy parcels they can control. Rather than deal with the uncontrollable crowd who were messy and demanding, they instead went fishing as they knew how to, back to their comfort zone to complete their own life's project.

When I was studying Environmental Chemistry, I was told by my supervising professor that "perhaps the project will need to be a shifting target"!

That didn't sit comfortably with me. I thought, I've already spent a year and a half doing a literature research, picking out what I was to achieve. If I changed tact now, or 'pivot', I may not be able to achieve anything that I can show to others and say "I'm worthy of a doctorate!". I might not even make it to receiving the celebratory chocolate fish they give every candidate upon submission of their thesis.

Catching no fish in our own life projects and goals is like the disciples' experience out at sea. Even with careful planning our best plans can fail. We're often asked to be content with 'second best' – indeed a fridge magnet I got as a present one time from a professor said "Shoot for the moon, and if you miss, you'll land amongst the stars". But I wonder, has God's plan ever failed or become second best for our lives?
