<u>St Andrew's Church – Parish Property Review meeting – Thursday 25 Nov 2021: 7 – 8.20 pm</u>

Attendance: 8 + 2(LFT) = 10 persons (including John and Clayton)

- John L opened the meeting with a reading from Acts 2:42-47 and a prayer
- Clayton D read the Cardinal's letter
- All attendees read a line each from Synod 2017 property outcomes
- John L posed the following question: What would you like our Parish to look like in 20years time?
- Increase the congregation in our church
- More lively, more diverse, more volunteers
- B4 LFT stepped in life was nice, very diverse congregation. However, since LFT took on role in last 3 years, people started arguing more, loss of community spirit and the parish has lost a lot of people because the Catholic church has lost its vision.
- Looking back 20 years, life was buzzing and good... Looked what worked then and portray this in the future.
- People are fed up with meetings, it's all talks for the last 5-6 years and nobody listens.
- Bring our lost sheep (Parishioners) back to the Catholic church and make it vibrant
- Bring Catholics back again
- Catholics to reach out to all Christians
- Look at why people flock to Pilgrimage spots in the world.. that is what we should aspire to be.
- Who appointed the LFT?
- Hub of activity and more people
- We need a Shepherd
- Parish merger was a catastrophe. We are still 3 churches and very few people mix. There is very little inter-attendance at Masses
- We need to address the issues of the merger. We need to become one Parish.
- Until the three churches go we won't be one Parish!
- Having one church would be a mess. Leave things as they are! We will manage. Why can't we just carry on?
- People don't know each other.
- I've been at St Andrew's for 50 years. We've got to get rid of 3 churches and build one church. In 20 years time, St. Andrew's land and assets will be most valuable so build the new Vision church on St Andrew's property.
- Why are we not thinking about the youth in 20 years' time
- Parishioners have volunteered and agreed to pay for repairs and leaks. People have asked for permission to fundraise but permission is not forthcoming.
- (John L): Pope says we need to look out to the people "on the peripheries"
- Who has the stats of the combined parish that say we are currently not reaching out. Tell people where exactly we need to step forward and they will find a solution.
- Messaging to people needs to be more direct and clear. We need to explain to people where we need help and ask for help.
- Pre-Covid survey undertaken asking where people can help (John L very limited responses to this survey).
- The survey results were not published. Why? (John L any survey that has been conducted has had outcomes reported in the Newsletter and/or website.
- Clarify areas where community is lacking

- Be more specific
- In 3 years Pete Roe has been around, we have not utilised his full potential.
- We had a televised liturgy service and the priest was sitting at the back!? We need a priest to get to the people.
- Lets have a lay person get to people
- Tawa has 2 priests
- From the 1st meeting at J'ville, we were told there is a lack of priests and the future is without priests. People were put off by this concept. (John L It has never been said that we don't want priests or need priests.)
- The model (collaborative Priest working with lay) not well explained.
- (John L): explained what "Nice to have" means:
 - None of our buildings is fit for community purposes.
 - It would be nice to have a relaxing area, theatre, commercial kitchen, community hall, etc
- We already have a community kitchen which is still going strong.
- We already have public community centres available in Newlands, J'ville and Kandallah.
- Per various: We need a multi-purpose centre (lounge, community centre, family and community gatherings, functions, celebrate feasts, free lunch (hospitality), chapel, theatrette, youth centre, café, bathrooms/showers for those in need, soup kitchen)
- Build a chapel
- Touch the youth (13 30 years), multi-media, youth centre
- What is going to make us "Catholic"? We don't need to duplicate what other organisations like Salvation Army already provide.
- Cater for the poor (Accommodation)
- Cater for the elderly pensioner flats
- The elderly need to be visited
- Retreat house
- Talk about religious aspect
- How do we as Catholics stand out?
- How are we going to promote vocations? We haven't called for vocations. (John Lour Church has been praying for vocations to priestly and religious life for generations! Maybe the Holy Spirit is sending them but we are looking in the wrong places?)
- Have retreats and attract vocations.
- Lets not forget the Catholic faith and religion maintain traditions
